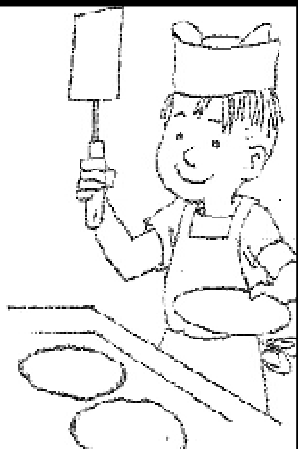

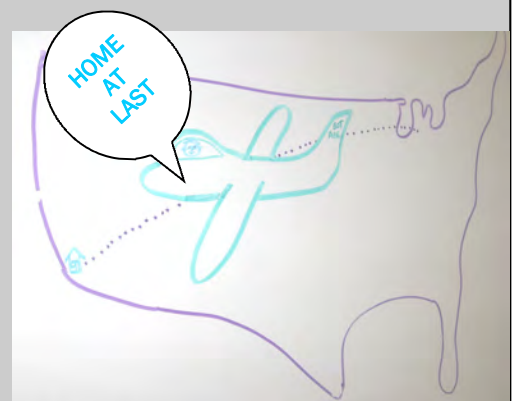


CASE CLOSED!

Update from our Missionaries

God Is Always At Work

In the last year, CRWRC has been challenged financially but God has not. One will almost assume that God will be marking time and waiting till money is flowing again for Him to work. It's amazing to know that God is at work when our purses are full and when they are lean. In him, everything is and is made.

What God requires for Him to work is our availability and partnership. He has provided resources in us, in our partners, and in the communities where we work so that any time we all put these resources together it's amazing what transformation we can witness.

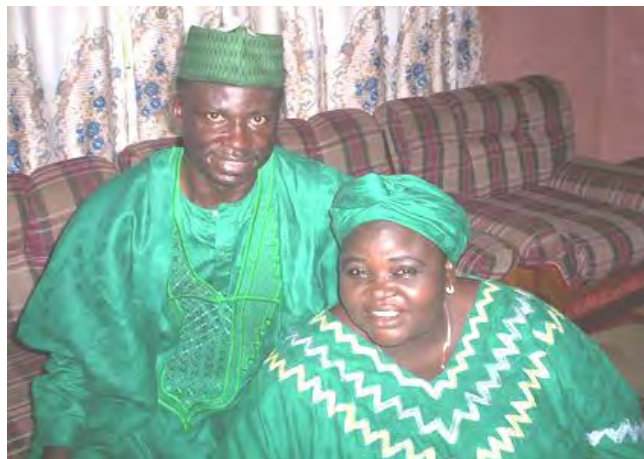
Nancy, one of our staff was sharing with me recently what God has been doing in Malawi through our partner and the community. you will find her story below:

"The setting was Mitundu, about 24 kms southeast of Lilongwe. We sat under some trees in the mid-morning. NRD (Nkhoma Relief and Development) brought a team of two men and three women from some of the village savings and loan groups (VSL) in Chipoka to visit with the Evangelical Lutheran Development Service (ELDS) VSL groups. Two Women in Development (WID) coordinators accompanied the group, and I spent some time with them on the second day of their visit. The learning visit was part VSL's efforts to empower participants with ideas for increasing share capital, enhancing group cohesiveness and investing their shares. ELDS very graciously provided us with an opportunity to visit with the groups which are large and well-established.

When I arrived in the sleepy little village of Mitundu, I found the group ready for us. They had set up chairs for their visitors and local leaders, and put down mats for group members to sit on. We watched with interest as the group went about its business, collecting shares and receiving loan repayments. This is a familiar sight to those of us who have visited a VSL group before.

The Chipoka team watched respectfully, and then took the opportunity to ask questions and give feedback. One would think that they had been coached by a professional trainer because they started by giving positive feedback and asking questions to genuinely learn from the group, and they showed utmost respect in the process. Some of their questions had to do with wanting to know how the group had invested their first dividends, how they maintain group cohesion, and how they deal with errant members.

Then, without warning, one member of the Chipoka group began to deliver a difficult series of observations: this type of direct feedback was surprising to all of us and is not typical of the Chewa culture to the best of my knowledge.



The Chipoka team challenged the group on their low level of savings! One of the men observed, "Your land is so fertile--why have you not made use of it to generate more savings? Our land is dry and barren in Chipoka, and we are trying to enrich it by growing trees and adapting new farming methods. When we look around here, we see so much abundance! Your soil is fertile, you are near markets, and we see trees around....If this was our home, we would be very far!"

Hearing these words coming from the Chipoka group was mesmerizing – it is testimony to the ongoing transformation and empowerment that is going on in the villages of Chipoka through the work of NRD with support from CRWRC!

Mrs. Muhanda, one of the WID coordinators quipped to me as we were preparing to leave, "The student has become the teacher!" The Chipoka folk came to learn, but they were now teaching the Mitundu group! The visit ended with songs and celebration as the Chipoka team shared some new tunes with their Mitundu counterparts and demonstrated how they go about their business. It was a magical moment, and I give God all the glory!

All of these amazing stories are happening because of your partnership with CRWRC. We appreciate your partnership in both financial and prayer support.

This morning, July 1, I baptized a young man, Enoch Wang, who is an exchange student from Shanghai, China. He told me about his parents who are poor farmers, how he has gone to school and done well and now is working on his Masters Degree and eventually wants to work on the PhD in Political Science, in either Canada, Australia or England.



He has attended Taipei International Church with another friend who was baptized in Phoenix last year. I asked Enoch, "Tell me how you learned about Jesus."

He told me the story we are so familiar with and yet when we hear it again and again it is exciting. Enoch's professor had

studied in the USA and came in contact with some Christians and my thoughts immediately went to Elder Tony Liu (of Golden Gate CRC) at Stanford. They taught Enoch's professor about the Lord and before he went back to China, he was baptized.

I could not help think about whether Enoch's professor was baptized at Golden Gate CRC, whether he had come in contact with Elder Liu, but whether we had a personal part in it or not, it is wonderful to know that the ministry Golden Gate, Crossroads and other similar churches working with overseas Chinese students and scholars has tremendous influence in ways we often don't see.

Today, being able to say to a young man in Taipei "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," and know the journey the Word took to move his heart is indeed thrilling.

He came up from the water with a big smile on his face and all those attending clapped celebratively.

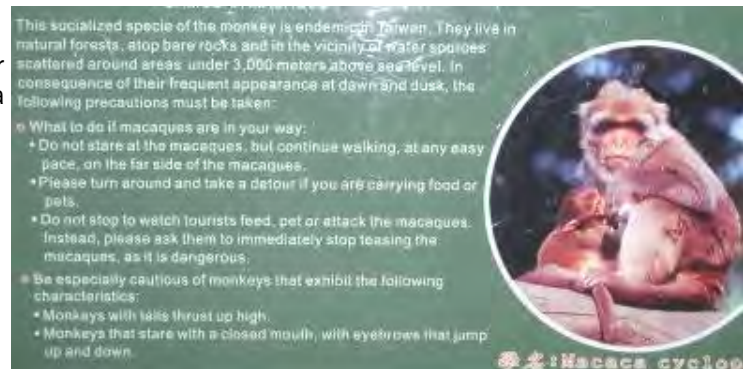
Today was also his birthday, so afterwards we went to our apartment and had birthday party for him, to celebrate his birthday and baptism.
